Dear Parents/Carers

You may be aware, through discussions with your child, that as a school we have been supporting the FIFA World Cup through a form group competition which is a combination of supporting the form group's allocated football team and rewarding good behaviour in lessons and around the school site.

Tuesday 29th June is one of the school's Challenge Days, during which students learn through projects rather than the regular timetabled lessons. On this day we will be continuing our support for the World Cup and will be asking students to attend school in football shirts, other sporting shirts, or in the colours of their form's football team. Students who wish to do this will be asked to contribute £1.00. Students choosing not to participate should wear their correct school uniform.

Year 9 students will be involved in practical and physical sessions throughout the day, and therefore should wear appropriate clothing for participating in PE as they will not be changing in between sessions. Students not participating in the football colours / shirts **must** wear their Bournville PE uniform.

Jeans / denim trousers will **not** be acceptable under any circumstances by any year groups. Tracksuit bottoms or non-denim trousers may be worn.

As part of our ongoing support of local, national and international charities the money raised on the Challenge Day will be divided between the Solihull Down Syndrome Support Group, Cafod – an International charity who work extensively to decrease poverty worldwide, and the Bournville School's Student Council, who will be making decisions on how to utilise the money raised to support the development of the students' environment and experiences here in school.

We look forward to the day with anticipation of the varied learning experiences, the enjoyment by students, and the opportunity to support others more in need than ourselves.
