Message from Mrs Cottle:

Following our long-awaited Ofsted inspection on the 31st October and 1st November, I am finally able to share the outcome with you. The team comprised of two Her Majesty's Inspectors, one of whom was a primary specialist and a further two secondary inspectors who spent two days gathering evidence from all phases of the school. During the course of the inspection, they met with me and members of my senior team on a number of occasions as well as spending time talking to teachers, students, associates, parents and carers. They observed many lessons and circulated amongst students during social times.

The Lead Inspector spoke about having seen "many thoroughly wonderful things" during the course of the inspection and commented on having spent some of the most "joyous moments" of his career whilst in the school. Hearing such comments made me feel incredibly proud of our students and staff who, together, have created a warm and caring atmosphere within Bournville School. As we would have expected, our students conducted themselves extremely well throughout the entire process and we all felt very proud of them.

Those of you who have read the report know that it describes the curriculum as "having a strong impact on current pupils' progress" and says that "many improvements are having a tangible, positive impact on pupils". The report also identifies personal development and welfare as being "Good" and describes all aspects of safeguarding as being "strong". It was also pleasing that they acknowledged the hard work



and commitment of staff who give their time to provide students with extra-curricular provision that is "strong and improving".

The "Requires Improvement" with "Good" for the Early Years Foundation Stage judgement reflected our own self-evaluation of the school and acknowledged many strengths as well as identifying areas for improvement. The report states that the senior team has "quickly improved many aspects of the school" whilst saying that "some of the changes have yet to make their full impact".

We are confident that our new teaching strategy will ensure the most-able pupils are consistently challenged and will lead to improved outcomes for **all** pupils. We will also continue to work to improve school attendance and seek your support in ensuring your children attend school regularly and on time. Thank you for your continued support and please rest assured that our dedicated Bournville staff will continue to strive to provide your children with a safe and nurturing learning environment where they are supported to achieve well and to realise their ambitions.

Punctuality To School: Please ensure that your child is on site for 8.35 as the Griffins Brook Lane entrance and student entrance on Hay Green Lane will close promptly.
