
Learning Behaviours

I thought this was a good time of year to share with you the strategy for teaching and learning we have adopted at Bournville, and across the Trust, so you know what you can expect from your child's lessons.

We call our strategy, 'Teaching for Excellence', and it is based on the Mastery strategy, this is adopted from the idea that students have a knowledge gap and the fastest, and most efficient way to plug that gap is simply to give these students the knowledge they are missing. The new curriculum that has been introduced in recent years, has a much larger body of knowledge for students to get to grips with and, we feel, this strategy is the best way for students to gain the knowledge needed to be successful. It is based on the premise that teachers are experts and our job is to pass that knowledge to students and then teach them what to do with the knowledge. These are key skills that are particularly important in the new curricula, this is a knowledge based curricula and so students need to be given that knowledge, lots of it, and ways to retain it and use it.

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Teaching for Excellence model



You will probably hear your child talking about 'Knowledge Organisers' they are A4 sheets that have the main knowledge for each topic, this is what we expect students to learn, this might be something you could get involved with at home. For example, I teach GCSE English Literature and year 10 have Knowledge Organisers for all set texts studied, these are also available on the school website:

Learning Behaviours poster


All staff have been trained in teaching in this way and have all had CPD, read the Science behind it and watched an expert teach in this way. To move forward, we are now introducing students to this model and to what we expect from them, **their LEARNER BEHAVIOURS**, we are explicitly teaching them how to be good learners using the Acronym DARTs.

We will be doing lots of work on this in Summer 2, including assemblies and lessons to children and we will be rewarding students who are displaying these behaviours. Please ensure that your child is on site for 8.35 as the Griffins Brook Lane entrance and student entrance on Hay Green Lane will close promptly.
