Message from Mrs Cottle:

As another school year draws to a close, there is certainly no sense of winding down here at Bournville! Students in Year 7 were the final year group to complete their end of year exams and, in common with all other year groups, their attitude and conduct was excellent throughout.

Other highlights have included a number of students in Year 10 taking part in a Level 3 Taster Day at Cadbury College which they later told me they thoroughly enjoyed and found really useful in helping them to decide on the post 16 destinations.

This week, the whole of Year 10 embarked on Work Experience where they spent a whole week developing their understanding of the world of work. They experienced a range of very different industries and professions including engineering, education, retail, and accountancy. Bournville staff who visited our students in the workplace were heartened to receive extremely positive feedback from employers who were impressed by our students' work ethic and level of enthusiasm.

Sporting events included a trip for Wimbledon for a group of lucky students and the Bournville Sports Day which took place at the Norman Green Stadium in Solihull. meet their new tutors, experience a range of lessons and activities and, most importantly, make lots of new friends!

End of term arrangements:

The summer term ends on Friday 20th July. Students will be dismissed between 12:15pm and 12:25pm. The canteen will not be open at lunchtime, but it will be open at break time if students require a meal.

Non-uniform day:

There will be a non-uniform day on Friday 20^{th} July. The recommended donation is £1, or students can donate an item to the Food Bank. The money raised will be used towards buying a defibrillator for the school which is a potentially lifesaving piece of equipment. A defibrillator is a device that gives a high energy electric shock to the heart through the chest wall to someone who is in cardiac arrest. This high energy shock is called defibrillation, and it's an essential lifesaving step in the chain of survival. The defibrillator will be added to a register and could benefit the local community as well as the school.

Food bank:

We are currently collection donations for the B30 Food Bank. If any parents / carers are able to donate any food items, there is a collection point in Bronte reception.

Safeguarding Concern – Doki Doki Game

We would like to make parents and carers aware of a new video game called Doki Doki which has featured in news reports recently. The game is a Japanese anime style game which begins innocently but as the game progresses players are encouraged to self-harm and ultimately kill themselves. The game is being linked to the death of a 15 year boy in Bury. If you have any concerns about this game, or any other concern about your child, please contact your child's form tutor or Head of Year.

Year 7 and 8 Bournville Summer Reading Project:

This summer our students in Y7 and Y8 are tasked with taking part in a summer reading project. They have each been given a passport to help them to explore the world of books. Their challenge is to read a million words this summer, and travel to new and wonderful places between the covers of books. Inside each passport is a beach ruler to measure their stack of books.

When they have completed a book, students should have the passport signed by a teacher or parent.

Prizes will be awarded to those who read a million words, and to those who make a real effort to complete more reading over the summer than they have done before! (For some students this will be one or two books, and for others this may be one a week.)
