#### Message from Mrs Cottle:



Welcome to the first edition of In the Know 2019!

Before breaking up for a well-deserved rest, students and staff embraced the spirit of the festive season by taking part in Christmas Jumper Day and raising funds for their respective House Charities. They also showed their concern for local families less fortunate than themselves by generously donating an impressive amount of food and consumables to the B30 Foodbank which was collected on the last day of term and distributed in time to help struggling families to have a more enjoyable Christmas.

Staff returned to school on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> January where they received training in a number of areas including the topic of mental health. This was a very informative presentation which outlined how staff can identify, respond to and support students who may be experiencing low mood or mental health issues.

Students returned to school on Tuesday and have settled in well to the demands of the new term. All Year groups have received assemblies reminding them of expectations around standards of conduct in and around school and when representing Bournville out in the community.

Year 11 received their mock GCSE results on Tuesday during an event which recreated the experience the will have when they receive their genuine results in August. Mrs Yarker delivered an assembly beforehand which focused on the importance of hard work and preparation during the coming weeks and months in order to maximise the chances of examination success.

On Thursday, Elevate returned to school to deliver another session to Year 11 to support them with devising revision timetables and a range of revision strategies. Student feedback was really positive and all considered it to be really helpful and worthwhile.

Finally, parents are reminded that the school car park is for the use of staff and visitors to the school and is not to be driven into when dropping off or picking up children. Despite having been asked not to, a number of parents are continuing to park in the school carpark which poses a risk to the safety of pupils. To prevent this situation from continuing, I have appointed a member of staff to ensure the gates remain closed at the start and end of the school day with access only to authorised vehicles. Please park considerately elsewhere ensuring that you are not blocking the driveways of our neighbours. Thank you to majority of parents and carers who always have been and continue to be co-operative in this matter.
