Please be advised of the following arrangements:

#### Last day of term, Friday 19th July 2019:

We are having a non-uniform day for primary and secondary students – we are asking for a food donation to the Trussell Trust B30 food bank. Students are requested to bring in non-perishable items to support local families in need during the school holiday period.

Primary students will be leaving school at 12.00noon.

Secondary students will take part in lessons as normal during periods 1 and 2, after which time they will have break, assemblies and form time, before being dismissed between 12.25pm and 12.35pm.



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## **Attendance:**

Please be reminded that the attendance target for all children is 97% which equates to no more than 5 days of absence throughout the whole academic year. Please avoid making medical or dental appointments during school time and be aware that we do not authorise holidays during term time, unless in exceptional circumstances.

Parents should be aware that we work closely with the local authority to prosecute parents who do not ensure their child has good attendance.

### **High Expectations of Uniform:**

As a school with traditional values, we expect all students to dress smartly. The expectation is that all students are in full school uniform every day. The full uniform policy is on our website, but in particular we would like to draw your attention to the following:

- Students must wear plain black school shoes if there is any doubt about whether it is a trainer or a school shoe, please assume it is not acceptable and do not be persuaded to buy anything other than school shoes for your child.
- Haircuts must not be extreme and on the natural spectrum (this is at the headteacher's discretion)
- Hooded sweatshirts, jackets or any other 'informal' tops are not allowed and will be confiscated;
- Students may wear one plain stud earring in each ear, worn in the lower ear lobe and a wristwatch (no smart watches). No other jewellery may be worn. This includes body and facial piercings (including tongue piercings, flesh tunnels and spikes). Jewellery should be removed for PE.

Students arriving to school dressed inappropriately will be challenged on arrival and expected to either; return home to change, borrow the item of uniform from school or, where this is not possible, be placed in re-focus until their uniform, hairstyle or piercing has been rectified.



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## **Excellent Learning Habits:**

We expect all students to be on time every day and for all lessons. We expect students to be fully prepared for, and focused on learning every day. This means:

- Energy drinks, drinks with added sugar, sweets and large bags of crisps or of chocolate are considered 'banned items' and will be confiscated
- Students should arrive at school by 8.35am. If students are late to school or unreasonably late to a lesson more than once in a week, they will serve a same-day, after school detention on a Friday.
- A suitable bag, pen, pencil, ruler and planner are expected. A rubber and colours would also be useful. Equipment and diaries will be checked every day in form time.
- We are a 'no touching school'. Pushing, shoving and boisterous behaviour will not be tolerated and will be sanctioned with a same-day after school detention. We want to ensure our students are safe and there is a calm, purposeful atmosphere so our students are ready for learning;
- Mobile phones MUST NOT be 'not seen or heard' on site. This is the same for headphones. Students may not use their phones until they have left the academy premises. Students should leave the school site by 3.15 unless they are involved in an after school activity as gates will lock at this time to ensure student safety. Any students left in school will be escorted out by staff;
- Failure to attend any detention set will result in a serious sanction. We expect every child to attend to meet with staff, reflect and restore positive working relationships.

We thank you for your ongoing support to ensure continued excellent behaviour, attendance and uniform, and we look forward to seeing your child again in September. We hope you have an enjoyable and restful summer break.

### **Car Parking**

Thank you to those parents and carers who are now parking away from the school entrance when dropping off and picking up children. Unfortunately, there are a minority of parents and carers who continue to try to gain access to the school site, despite the safeguarding implications of so doing and who park their vehicles in a manner that obstructs pavements and driveways. Understandably, local residents remain very upset and concerned about this lack of consideration and we are working closely with police, local councillors and Birmingham City Council to take



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measures to improve road safety for all users. Please support us to keeping Bournville School and the surrounding area safe by parking legally and considerately.

Students need to arrive for the times below, in full uniform. Students will be in normal lessons from period 3 onwards and will need to bring all of their equipment including their PE kit. New Year 7 students should arrive at 9am and go straight to the PPC. Students in other year groups should go to their form rooms for registration at the times listed below. We would ask that students do not arrive on site more than five minutes prior to this.
