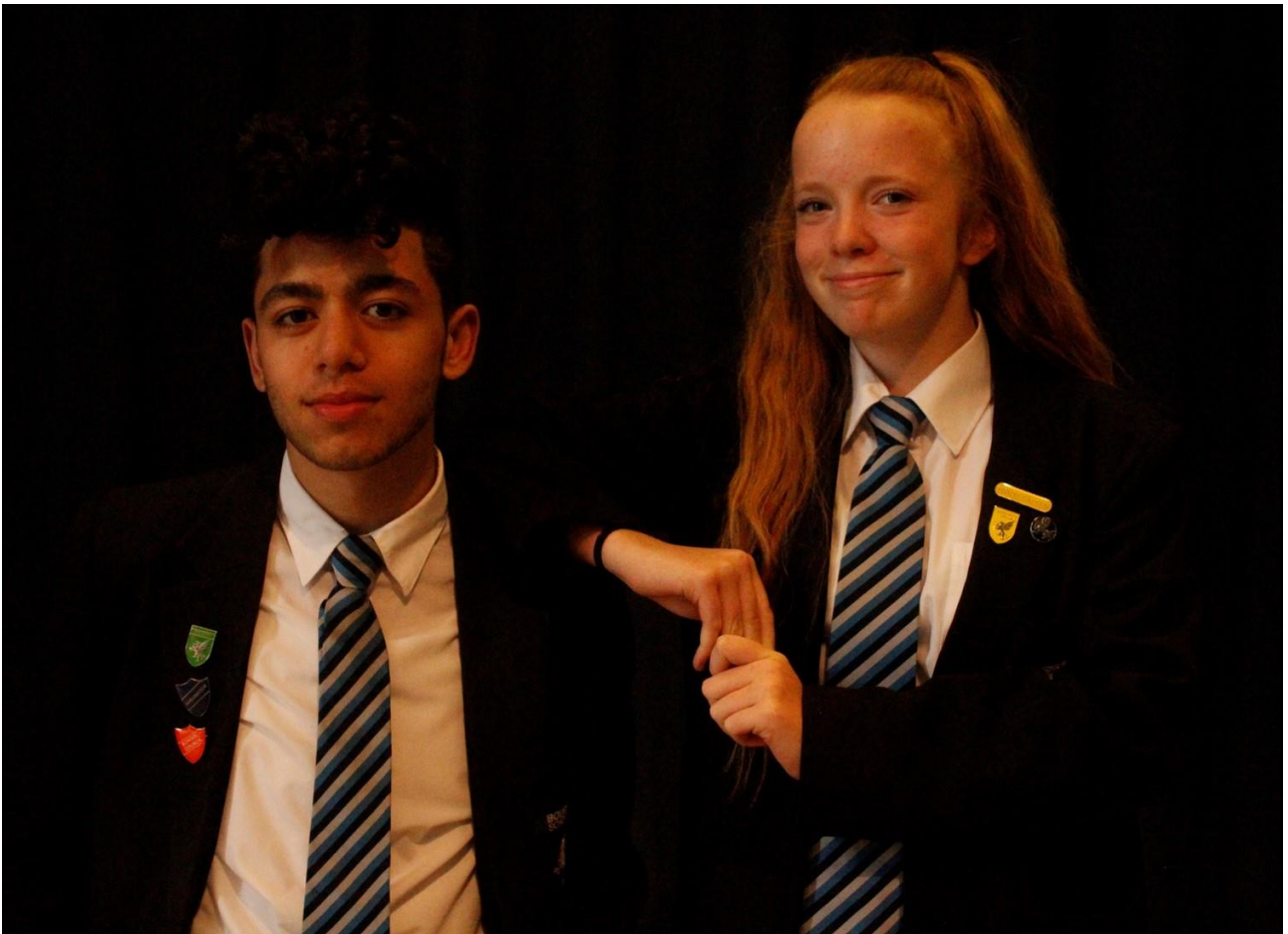

#### **Uniform Borrowing**

The expectation is that students arrive every day in school uniform. Students who need to borrow an item of uniform will find that the 'Uniform Exchange' room in the Morris building will close at 8.30 each day from Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> June.

Therefore, if students do not have an item of uniform and wish to borrow a blazer, tie or shoes in the rare event they should not have theirs, they will need to visit the room before 8.30 to ensure they are ready for school. Uniform is checked every day by their form tutor and students can expect to receive a sanction if wearing incorrect uniform by 8.40 when their tutor time session begins.

These students in Year 7 and Year 8 are our most improved readers, and will have the opportunity to attend the Alex Rider YHA trip because they have shown enormous commitment to their reading and excellent improvement – well done! As a part of our drive to encourage students to read fiction as widely as possible, we have chosen 14 students, who have recently excelled in reading and made an improvement, to take part in a trip as a reward for their effort. The trip is to the Wye Valley where students will take part in a two day Alex Rider themed Spy Training Mission run by the Youth Hostel Association.

Alex Rider is the hero of a series of Anthony Horowitz spy themed novels. On the trip students will have the chance to take part in reading themed spy training activities which will be exciting and link to their reading of the novels. They will each be presented with a copy of the novel, and will then take part in archery (run by Team Great Britain Archers), code breaking, orienteering, and bush craft (building shelters and learning survival skills). All of these activities will be run by experienced instructors from the YHA who have Learning Outside The Classroom certification, and students will also be accompanied by two teachers from Bournville. - **Year 9 Broadening Horizons Day** - Pupils in year 9 took part in a Broadening Horizons day held at Edgbaston Cricket Ground. Aimhigher Plus put on this event to help pupils understand what it takes to be successful in the world of work, as well as exposing pupils to new careers. Our pupils completed a mock assessment centre, where a series of challenges tested some of the key skills needed to get a job. Pupils completed logic puzzles, collected key information as well as putting their handshakes to the test. In addition, year 9 pupils completed a careers carousel, talking to many individuals from some very interesting careers. The year 9 pupils who attended came away with a greater knowledge of the world of work and were a credit to the school.

YEAR 10

- **Year 10 Careers in TV and the Media Day** - 8 Year 10 pupils were tasked with the challenge of creating a short film highlighting the advantages of university to their peers. Our pupils worked hard before the sessions to plan their short film and allocate roles for the filming day. On the day, year 10 attended a university level lecture about audio-visual illusions as well as filming and editing their work with a professional film crew. The final piece was both professional and creative. The film was screened in the media studio at the University of Birmingham. Pupils demonstrated their ability to work to a brief as a team as well as learning that a career in TV and media is so much broader than acting.

YEAR 11

- If students have any revision guides that they no longer need, can they please be returned to school so that they can be passed on and used again by other students.

- Prom is on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June at the Botanical Gardens. Students should arrive from 6:30pm for a 7pm start.
