Bournville staff and students gathered on the playground for a collective act of remembrance on Friday 8th November where we observed two minutes silence signalled by the Last Post. It was a poignant and deeply respectful moment shared by all members of the school community.

Last week saw Year 11 students taking part in after school and lunchtime revision sessions in a number of subjects and it was really encouraging to see the increase in students accessing the

excellent revision resources posted on Show My Homework, Twitter and the school Instagram page. The mock exams started this week and are going well.

Last week a group of Year 9 students were invited to take part in an Aim Higher trip to Birmingham University for a SCI-FY day. Students found the outing really inspiring and several commented that they are now contemplating going on to higher education, having not previously considered this option.

Students in Year 9 are in the midst of their milestone assessments which are giving them an opportunity to demonstrate how well they have learnt the new topics they have encountered at the start of their KS4 programme of study.


All Years Table Tennis Club:
