## Collection of GCSE Certificates:

Certificates for official exams taken in the Summer term are now ready for collection.

Please phone the school on 0121 475 3881 ensuring that you give at least 24 hours' notice.

All certificates must be signed for and a formal proof of ID will be required (passport, birth certificate etc.) If a student is unable to collect his/her certificates they can nominate a responsible adult (or a fellow student) to collect the certificates on their behalf. Before this can happen, however, the students must write to the Examinations Office, giving the name of the person who will be collecting their certificates. The nominated person will be required to provide formal identification when collecting.

## Attendance and Punctuality:

The target attendance figure for all students is a **minimum of 97% attendance**. This equates to no more than 5 days of absence over the whole school year.

Regular attendance is not just a legal requirement, but it is vital for students to maximise their learning and achieve their full potential here at Bournville. There are a number of important steps that you can take to ensure that your child maintains a high level of attendance:

- Ensure your child attends every day, on time, equipped and ready to learn. Students must be in school from 8.35 am ready for registration with their tutor at 8.40 am. Please be aware that students arriving late to school will receive a break time detention on the same day.
- Ensure the school has up-to-date addresses and telephone numbers to contact you.
- If your child is ill, contact the school and provide an explanatory note on their return to school. Please make sure you telephone every day your child is absent.
- Ensure that medical appointments are made outside of school time.
- Holidays are not to be taken in school time. Holidays will not be authorised during term time other than in exceptional circumstances.
- Contact your child's Student Support Officer or Form Tutor.
