Message from Miss Green:

A key element to the gold grade is going above and beyond and being a role model at Bournville school.

Personal Development Behaviour & Welfare

We have 3 key focus areas to ensure that student behaviour is of the highest standard and enables all at Bournville to learn and fulfil their potential.

Internal Truancy - if students are internally truanting they will receive a red grade and a detention. If this happens twice in one day the student will immediately be internally excluded with work for the rest of the day provided. Prompt attendance to all lessons and engagement in them is crucial to students' progress. Repeated internal truancy will require parental meetings and a home-school contract will be issued with specific individual expectations and targets for the students concerned.

Non-compliance- students are expected to comply with staff instructions first time, every time. If this is not heeded the appropriate graded consequence will occur using the GAR system, the ultimate consequence being a fixed term exclusion for continued non-compliance and defiance.

Mobile Phones in School- the expectation is that all phones are switched off and kept in students'

bags. If phones are seen by staff, a polite reminder will be given regarding school policy. If this request is ignored the phone will be confiscated for that lesson and returned. If this is a repeated issue parents or carers will be called in for further discussions with Heads of Year and SLT.

Your support and timely reminders to your child about the high expectations above will be hugely appreciated and will undoubtedly result in improved progress at Bournville school for your child.

Please speak to your child about what they would like to do for work experience and encourage them to go and speak to businesses to arrange this. Students have been advised of how to arrange their work experience, and what information they need to bring to school about their placement.
