

Clerical re-checks, reviews of marking and appeals – Candidate Consent Form

Information for Candidates

The following information explains what may happen following a clerical re-check or a review of the original marking, or then a subsequent appeal for one of your examinations after your subject grade has been issued. There are 3 possible outcomes.

- Your original mark is lowered so your final grade may be lower than the original grade you received.
- Your original mark is confirmed as correct so there is no change to your grade.
- Your original grade is raised so your final grade may be higher than the original grade you received.

To proceed with the clerical re-check or review of marking, you must sign the form below. This tells the principle of your school that you have understood what the outcome may be, and you give your consent to the clerical re-check or review of marking being submitted.
