RE: Industrial action on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April and Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2023

Dear Parent / Carer,

You may be aware from media coverage that The NEU have declared further strike action, which will take place on the following dates:

- Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April 2023
- Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2023

The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay and conditions, not because of any issues at our school.

We have been working closely with our staff union representatives to keep up to date with the situation. There is a significant membership of NEU members at Bournville, therefore there will be a partial closure of the school.

- The primary phase of our school will be unaffected. All children in primary will be able to come to school as normal.
- The secondary phase of our school will be open for our most vulnerable students. We will contact the families of these students so that we can plan accordingly.
- The secondary phase will also be open for Year 11 both days – please see the specific details in the table below.
- The secondary phase will also be open for Year 10 on 27<sup>th</sup> April - please see the specific details in the table below.

Definition – Families who are involved with social services and may have a social worker. Students who have an Education and Healthcare Plan (EHCP).


