





Arts subjects go together well in options choices and for a range of future careers. For example, in professional theatre, Drama uses skills of Theatre and Visual Art and Dance and Music, all combined.







#### **Community arts worker**



Community arts workers help local communities plan and take part in activities like drama, dance, painting, and photography.





#### **Gallery curator**



Gallery curators manage collections of paintings and objects.





#### Visual effects (VFX) artist



VFX artists make something computer generated look as realistic as possible in post production for films and TV





#### Choreographer



Choreographers design sequences of steps and movements, usually accompanied by music, for dancers and other artists to perform.






#### Model maker



Model makers design and make 3D scale models to show how buildings or products will look.





#### Art valuer



Art valuers give advice on how much a piece of art or a collection of art is worth.





#### Art director (TV or film)



An art director for TV, film or theatre supports the production team and directors in bringing their creative vision to life.





#### **Animator**



Animators bring drawings and computer generated characters to life on screen.





#### **Intimacy coordinator**



Intimacy coordinators choreograph scenes of physical intimacy in TV, theatre or film.





#### **Games artist**



Games artists create designs for the environment, objects, people, creatures, and overall feel of a game.





#### Singer



Sing songs on stage, radio, television, or motion pictures.





#### **CAD** technician



Computer-aided design (CAD) technicians create technical drawings for products used in the engineering, manufacturing and construction industries.






#### Film colourist



Colourists define a colour palette for adverts, films, and music videos to help set the tone and mood of the piece.





#### Pop musician



Pop musicians perform and record different styles of music.






#### Music producer



Music producers oversee the creation of a song, soundtrack, or album.






#### **Art therapist**



Art therapists help people express difficult thoughts and feelings through creative activities.





#### Classical musician



Classical musicians and singers perform classical music in concert, or on film, TV, or radio recordings.





#### Music teacher



Music teachers give music lessons to people of all ages and abilities.





#### Mix engineer



Mix engineers combine the different sonic elements of a recording into a final version.





#### Session musician



A Session Musician performs a backing track for another musician, while performing onstage or recording in studio.






#### **Music conductor**



Direct and conduct instrumental or vocal performances by musical groups, such as orchestras or choirs.





#### Music composer and arranger

Write and transcribe musical scores.







#### **Music director**



Music directors are responsible for all of the musical aspects of a performance, production, or organization.





#### Comedian



Comedians make people laugh for a living.





#### **Theatre director**



Theatre directors are responsible for the interpretation of a script by performers on-stage.






#### Web designer



Web designers use their creative and technical skills to design new websites and redesign existing ones.






#### **Tattooist**



Tattooists create permanent artwork on their clients' bodies.





#### **Dance movement therapist**



Dance movement therapists use dance and movement to help people deal with emotional, psychological and physical issues.





#### **Play therapist**



Play therapists help children to make sense of difficult life experiences or complex psychological issues through play.





#### **Dance teacher**



Dance teachers train and develop their pupils in all types of dance.





#### Theatre producer



Coordinate the technical and logistical aspects of a theatrical production.





#### Circus performer



Circus performers entertain audiences with displays of skills like acrobatics and clowning.





#### Roadie



Roadies help stage music concerts, setting up before the show, looking after instruments and packing away afterwards.





#### **Dancer**



Dancers use movement to perform for live audiences or in recorded performances.





### Stage manager



Stage managers makes sure the sets, equipment and props are ready for the opening of a performance.





### **Music therapist**



Music therapists use music and sound to help improve people's emotional well being, relieve stress and improve confidence.

DJs play music for audiences at venues, or on the radio.






### **Events manager**



Events managers organise and run promotional, business and social events.





### **Stunt performer**



Stunt performers stand in for actors when the script calls for anything dangerous or specialised to be done on a film or TV set.





### **Dramatherapist**



Dramatherapists use group work, role play and movement to help people with their feelings and emotions.






### Stagehand



Stagehands help to get things ready on set for performances in the theatre, at concerts and in TV and film studios.





#### **Arts administrator**



Arts administrators help to organise events and exhibitions, manage staff, and look after buildings like theatres or museums.





#### **Fine artist**



Fine artists create original works of art using methods like painting, drawing and sculpture.





### **Packaging designer**



Packaging designers design and develop packaging for different products.





### **Costume designer**



Costume designers are responsible for the overall look of the clothes and costumes in theatre, film or television productions.





#### **Picture framer**



Picture framers mount items like photographs, artwork or other objects for display.





### **Fashion designer**



Fashion designers design clothing and fashion ranges.





### Set designer



Set designers design and create the setting for a television, theatre or film production.





#### Wardrobe assistant



Wardrobe assistants help to create, source, and organise the clothes and costumes used in theatre, film, and TV productions.





#### Ceramicist



Ceramicists design and create products made from clay.





### **Shopfitter**



Shopfitters make and install fixtures and fittings in offices, restaurants, shops and bars.





#### Glass worker



Glass workers produce and decorate a wide variety of glass objects, from crystal vases to test tubes.





### Interior designer



Interior designers plan and supervise the design and decoration of the inside of buildings.





#### Actor



Actors use speech, movement and expression to bring characters to life in theatre, film, television and radio.






### **Prop maker**



Prop makers create objects for use in films, TV programmes and the theatre.





### Illustrator



Illustrators produce drawings, paintings, and diagrams for use in products and packaging.





### **Talent agent**



Talent agents promote and manage the business affairs of performers and other professionals in the entertainment industry.






### Studio sound engineer



Studio sound engineers work in studios and make recordings of music, speech and sound effects.





### Producer (TV or film)



TV and film producers oversee the production process of a programme or film. This could include creative vision, budgeting and marketing.






### Production runner (TV or film)



Runners work behind the scenes in TV or film, doing small jobs and basic tasks to help the production run smoothly.





#### **Casting director**



As a Casting director, you'll be hired by a TV, film or theatre production company, or studio, to find the right performers for a project.





#### Grip



Grips work on a film or TV set to prepare the nonelectrical equipment that helps move or carry the cameras, including cranes, tripods, vehicle rigs, and dollies.
