Year 1 – Mrs Clay and Miss Hutchison



This month, Year 6 were delighted to visit the hospital to perform for the patients. We sang beautifully, showcasing all the songs we have been practising, and were proud to help raise funds for The Royal Orthopaedic Charity, which supports the hospital's vital work.

In science, we have been thoroughly enjoying our topic on Electricity. We have learned the scientific

symbols for various circuit components, how to draw circuits accurately, and the meaning of key vocabulary such as voltage and current. A particular highlight was planning and



conducting an exciting scientific experiment with Miss Messina. We investigated how the length of the wire affects the sound of the buzzer and explored the scientific reasoning behind it and used a decibel metre to measure the outcome.

We observed that the buzzer became quieter as the wire length increased. This happened because the longer the wire, the greater the resistance in the circuit. Increased resistance reduces the current flowing through the circuit, which in turn decreases the energy available to power the buzzer, resulting in a quieter



sound.
