Aim Higher Study Skills Workshops

All of our students will have formal end of year assessments over the coming weeks to assess their knowledge and understanding as follows:

- Year 11: GCSE examinations (start W/C 6th May)
- Year 10: Y10 mocks (W/C 16th June)
- Year 9: BASE and GL assessments (W/C 2nd and 9th June)
- Year 8: BASE and GL assessments (W/C 2nd and 9th June)
- Year 7: BASE and GL assessments (W/C 2nd and 9th June)



Preparation is key and students must do some independent learning and revision out of school hours in order to achieve their best and to support the excellent work they are doing in school.

In PSHE lessons we are teaching students how to revise. They create revision timetables and learn a range of techniques they can use to revise effectively. Their teachers will also provide plenty of resources to support their exam preparation.

For our Y10 students who will experience the formality of how their GCSE exams will run for the first time, we were really pleased to welcome Aim Higher into school yesterday to deliver an assembly and workshops about effective study skills. Students commented on how useful they had found the session and how it made them realise what they should be doing to achieve success.

We will continue to prepare students over the coming weeks and wish them all the very best of luck in the exams when they come.

FD2-ITC Enterprise Project

The Young Entrepreneur Project is a workshop which has run over the past 6 weeks for business students. The programme gives the students the opportunity to design an item of clothing to their liking, and then have the item manufactured. In between that time the students then learn the process behind manufacturing and all other aspects of fashion and the business elements behind it. The aim is to empower the students and give them a platform to express themselves and grow in confidence, all in a creative environment. The programme concludes with the students receiving their fully custom-made item of clothing, a certificate and showcasing their finished designs.

The program covers various areas of the curriculum including English, Art, DT, business, reading, maths and PSHE. Students have thoroughly enjoyed the experience!



Barber Institute

Over the past half term, a selection of creative KS3 students have worked with representatives from the Barber Institute. Sessions have included working with local poets and artists as well as having the opportunity to see artwork from the gallery itself. This has been a unique experience, and students have created illustrations and paintings inspired by their visitors; work they can be proud of!

Y10 HSC students learn First Aid

Our Level 2 Health and Social Care students recently had the chance to take part in hands-on first aid training with expert trainers from St Johns Ambulance. The session taught them life-saving skills such as CPR, wound care and the importance of the recovery position in the event of an emergency.

This training didn't just give them practical skills—it also boosted their confidence and prepared them should they choose to continue to work in care homes, hospitals and community healthcare teams in the future. First aid isn't just a skill—it's a way to make a real difference in someone's life, especially in high-pressure moments. Our students are now better equipped to handle whatever challenges come their way.



Feedback from students was positive:

"I found the sessions useful because they covered both the practical and theoretical sides of first aid. We didn't just learn how to do it—we also learned why it's important and how to apply it in real situations".

The students were thoroughly engaged, especially in the practical element of the course; they individually performed CPR on the mannequin and placed their patient in the recovery position. All students will now receive a certificate demonstrating their achievement.

Barclays Life Skills Workshops

Our Y9 students had the chance to work with representatives from Barclays Bank on developing their financial literacy and to develop employability skills.



GSUS Live Workshops

KS3 students enjoyed GSUS live in RS lessons this past half term. This was a unique opportunity for them to do interactive multimedia sessions on a variety of PSHE themes. E24 was transformed with displays and technology providing an exciting backdrop to their lessons.
