Thank You

WOW – we are at the end of another year! September 2024 seems a long time ago now and I am sure you will agree, your children have grown a lot in maturity, personally, socially and academically. Thank you for all your support with homework this year. Those children that have worked consistently across the year have seen greater results in their assessments. Learning the basics of reading, times tables and spellings at home, make a noticeable improvement on children's independence in school. I know that for some parents, trying to get their children to complete to homework regularly started as a bit of a battle, but those that stuck to the agreement have seen their children reap the rewards. Parenting is a tough job and I know that some days it can feel thankless, however consistency does pay off in the long run. Some of your children's results have soared.

Year 6 SATS

We are very proud of our Year 6's this year as most have really taken the challenge of working hard to become independent in order to help them prepare for secondary school. They have aimed to: wear the correct uniform including shoes, completed homework weekly, work to be role models around the school, taken feedback on their work in order to get better and enjoyed the experience of taking part in lessons in secondary this term. I am particularly impressed with the Bird Houses they made in the secondary DT department with Mr Lowe (thank you Mr Lowe for giving your free time). To reflect this, our Key Stage 2 Results are some of the best results we've seen. This really does demonstrate that hard work, commitment and consistency pay off. This is also testament to the tireless work of Miss Withy and Mrs Hathaway who worked strategically to ensure the children were provided with the things they needed in order to improve. The children couldn't have done it without them so thank you.

Attendance

This is one area we have to keep working on to improve and I am un-apologetic about it. Not only do your children deserve to have the best education, they also deserve to be in school every day. We have noticed that those children whose attendance has fallen below 90% have not achieved as well and, in some cases, sadly, have fallen behind. Too many days off school has a direct impact on how well your children perform personally, socially and academically. For some, their anxiety increases with time off school, they miss learning as we cannot repeat learning over and over again and it also really effects their friendships.

We will be holding meetings in September with parents/carers of children we are particularly concerned about as it is important we carry out our duties as professionals and ensure your child receives the full time education they are entitled to. Those parents who have worked with us this year, have certainly felt the benefits at home as well as seen the difference in their children at school. If attendance has been an issue for you this year, please reflect on this over the summer and make a plan on how things can improve for your child next year so they have the best chance possible.

Uniform

Please don't forget to purchase new uniform for September. NO BRANDED TRAINERS ALLOWED. We do not want children/parents/carers feeling the pressure to have to purchase branded items therefore, all footwear, must be unbranded.


