


PRIMARY NEWSLETTER June 2025



Dear Parents/ Grandparents/ Carers,

Transition Day

On Wednesday 2nd July, our Year 6 pupils will be visiting their secondary schools and so we will be holding our own Primary Transition Day on this day too. We find it is a helpful thing to do to prepare the children for September. They will be with their new teachers/assistant teachers for the day in their new classrooms.

To keep the morning and after school routines the same for children (and yourselves), they will arrive and be collected from their usual classroom door. During the school day, they will transition to their new class with the following staff:

- Mrs Clay & Miss Bell will be teaching Reception & will also cover Year 1/2 PPA
- Reception and Year 1 will be combining to create a Year 1/2 Class and they will have a new teacher called Mrs Hughes (pictured right) and Miss Walker will be their assistant teacher.



- Year 2/3 will move up to become 3/4 and will have Miss Heyer.
- Year 4 will be moving up to Year 5 with a new staff member called Miss Saleh (pictured right) and we will be interviewing for a new assistant teacher.



- Year 5 will be moving to Year 6 with Mr Newton and Mrs Hathaway as their assistant teacher.
- Miss Hutchison & a new assistant teacher will be working in The Nest.

We are fortunate that our new teachers will be around for a few days next week so you will able to say hello and put a face to the name. They will be spending time

with the children they will be teaching so they are prepared to teach them in September.

This is always a hard transition as you want to keep everyone however it is important for staff to grow in their field and step into new opportunities. Reception – Miss Bell

Our Learning Adventure with David Hockney's A Bigger Splash

We have had a wonderfully creative few weeks in Reception as we explored the work of the famous British artist **David Hockney**, focusing on one of his most iconic paintings, **A Bigger Splash**.



The children have been fascinated by the bright colours, bold shapes, and the way Hockney

captures the feeling of summer and water. We've talked about how the painting makes us feel and what we think might be happening in the scene – the splashing water certainly sparked lots of imaginative ideas!



Art & Creativity – The children experimented with different ways to create their own "splash" paintings, using paint and water techniques. One of their favourite activities was using brushes to flick paint onto the paper to create the effect of water splashing – it was so

much fun, and very effective! They also explored using a range of different sized paintbrushes to see how this changed the look of their artwork.



El Language & Discussion – We developed our speaking and listening skills by sharing our thoughts about the painting. The children came up with fantastic stories about who might have jumped into the pool and what might happen next.

** Fine Motor Skills – The children practised careful painting and explored how to hold and control different sized brushes, helping to strengthen their hand muscles and coordination.

** Personal Development – We encouraged the children to be confident in expressing their ideas and proud of their artwork, just like real artists!

It has been a joy to see the children's creativity and confidence grow through this project. Their artwork is now proudly displayed in the classroom – do have a look when you next visit!

Year 1 - Miss Clay

This has been another busy month in Year one. June is the month when year one children across the whole country complete their phonic screening check. We have been revising our phonic sounds and many children have attended an after-school club to help them along. Phonics is an essential building block in helping the children become fluent readers and all of our year one children have worked extremely hard in their phonics lessons.



As well as phonics, the children have been working hard on their maths. Over the last few weeks, we have been learning about fractions. We have been sharing shapes, objects, and quantities in half and into quarters. The children particularly enjoyed it when we used cakes and biscuits to share in our fraction work.

Finally, we have had a great time using junk modelling materials to make model windmills. The children had the opportunity to explore how to attach a windsail and how to ensure that the model could be freestanding before making their

models. They were really excited to try them out.

Well done, Thierry! We are all so proud of you and will be cheering you on every step of the way. Keep reaching for your goals—both on and off the pitch!


Year 2 and Year 3 Shine with their Cursive Handwriting!




This term, Year 2 and Year 3 have been putting in an incredible amount of effort into developing their cursive handwriting — and it's paying off!



Year 5 with Mr Newton and Miss Dashti


This month, Year 5 have been learning a lot.


Maths: Please can you keep learning all the times tables up to the 12 times table with your children.

UNIFORM FOR PRIMARY

Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 (EYFS & Key Stage 1)

- Black shoes only.
- Plain white, black or grey socks / black tights.
- Black pleated skirt below the knee or black trousers.
- Blue Navy Bournville jumper V-neck style.
- White polo shirt.
- No hair colours that are unnatural (green, pink, bright red, purple, blue, etc).

A recent consultation was held with parents/carers regarding school uniform. Following on from this, the decision has been made to bring the school uniform in line with Key Stage 3 & 4 to start bringing the 'All-Through' nature of our school together. As we are one school community, we want the children at our school to reflect this in the way they present themselves so when we join together, we look and behave as one.

Please see the changes below and prepare your uniform early, ready for a September start. Uniform will be checked and any pupil who is not wearing the correct uniform will be provided with the correct uniform to wear

for day in line with the school policy. Please can you support your children fully with this, ensuring the correct school shoes.

Uniform during Summer

- In the classrooms students can take off their jumpers / cardigans if they feel hot.
- During the summertime can wear short sleeve shirts and take their jumpers/cardigans off.
- Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 only can wear knee length school trousers in the summer.

Years 3 to Year 6 (Key Stage 2)

- Black leather polishable shoes only.
- Black pleated skirts below the knee or plain black trousers only (no leggings, no flares, etc).
- Bournville V-neck jumper or Cardigan with logo.
- White shirt
- Bournville clip on tie.
- No hair colours that are unnatural (green, pink, bright red, purple, blue etc).



HEADWEAR

- Head scarves should be plain and single coloured - navy or black
- Hair accessories/bobbles should be small and in plain navy or black

JEWELLERY

- Plain stud earrings
- A wristwatch

No other jewellery permitted

PE KIT

RECEPTION TO YEAR 6

- Black shorts
- Plain house t-shirt (red, blue, yellow, green)
- Black pumps/trainers
- Bournville logo PE bag (optional)

PE KIT SEASONAL VARIATIONS

AUTUMN & SPRING

- Plain navy jogging bottoms or leggings
- Plain navy sports jumper

Jewellery should be removed for PE or earrings should be taped over.
